We are pleased to continue supporting the vital needs of adults in several areas and we are participants in the District's Strategic Plan. We serve thousands of parents in our community through classes that will both support their children in school and success in the future.

Because we know our students lead diverse lives, we use in-person, hybrid, and distance learning models to accommodate our students' busy schedules. For those seeking an in-person classroom experience, we have campuses in Arden-Arcade (located at Encina High School) and in Citrus Heights (at our Sunrise Tech Center campus). We also offer several classes on-line for those who want to participate from home.

Students may take classes in High School Completion/Equivalency (HSD/HSE), learning English as a secondary language (ESL), career technical education (CTE), as well as enrichment course through our Community Education program. We are also an official GED Testing Center (at our Sunrise Tech campus). Our HSD program is WASC- accredited, so that our diploma is recognized nationwide on par with high school programs across the country.

Our HSD/HSE and ESL courses are offered free of charge, while our CTE and community education courses are fee-based.



Registration Information

- On-line registration is required for all classes. Computers are available at the Sunrise Tech and Encina offices for students to use for registration.
- ESL, and CTE courses require mandatory attendance to an Orientation meeting prior to enrollment into courses.
- Registration is on a first-come, first-served basis until classes are full.
- Classes that don't meet the minimum enrollment or that have low attendance may be cancelled. Any applicable fees will be refunded.
- Unless the course is cancelled by the school, refunds for fee-based courses are NOT available.
- San Juan Unified School District Adult Education classes are open to all adults age 18 and above and are designed to meet the needs of adults.

Academics High School Diploma & High School Equivalency

High School Diploma

Adult students can earn their high school diploma at San Juan Adult Education.

Our high school completion program is accredited by the Western Association of High Schools and Colleges (WASC), the same organization that accredits all high schools in the district.

High School Equivalency

San Juan Adult Education offers GED preparation courses to equip students for success. Students work at their own pace as they focus on the skills they need to improve for this high school equivalency program.

All students interested in GED classes must attend an orientation session to determine level for appropriate course placement. Your first step is to register at High School Equivalency Registration. Once you have registered, one of our HSE staff members will reach out to you to set up an orientation and enrollment.



Academics English as a Second Language

English as a Second Language

Literacy, beginning, intermediate, and advanced ESL classes are offered on a continuous open-enrollment basis. With a focus on English for work, home, school, and the community, these classes help develop and improve skills in listening, speaking, reading, and writing.

Basic Computer Skills for ESL Students

In the Basic Computer Skills class, ESL students will learn essential computer skills including accessing and using Gmail and other Google apps (Docs, Slides, etc.), and safely using web browsers and search engin Additionally, students can practice keyboardis writing simple emails, and preparing a resume.



ESL Bridge to Adult Secondary Education Prepare for your GED and HSD

This bridge class helps ESL students prepare for the GED® and HiSET® tests.

This class is designed to meet the English language needs of adult learners who would like to transition from the ESL program to either the GED or High School Diploma program.

This course covers intermediate English language skills and Mathematics. Students will master the English and Math skills needed to be admitted to the high school completion program.



The Communications Skills classes (low and high levels) help students develop their conversational skills and increase their fluency in spoken English. Students will learn to use appropriate vocabulary to communicate clearly and practice pronunciation, sound discrimination, stress, and intonation.

Citizenship Preparation

The Citizenship Preparation class prepares students for the US Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) interview as they study to improve their English reading, writing, listening, and speaking skills.

Career Technical Preparation & Workforce Readiness Clinical Medical Assistant

Clinical Medical Assistant (CMA) (Externship included)

In this full-day, fast-paced, comprehensive certificate program, students can learn medical terminology and receive industry-standard clinical/back-office training in just one semester.

The CMA program includes two concurrent segments:

 Medical Terminology: Learn the language of medicine by understanding word elements and how they correlate with the human body's anatomy and physiology and associated diseases, conditions, and treatments. Students will learn to pronounce, spell, and analyze medical words, and read medical reports, records, and prescriptions. In addition, this segment also includes frontoffice skills such as scheduling appointments and some medical office computer training.

NOTE: Students successfully completing this segment are eligible for community college credits through American River College.

2. Clinical Course: Students learn CMA clinical skills, including how to interview patients, position patients for all medical exams, take adult/infant vitals, give injections, perform a venipuncture, read an EKG/ECG, and more. Students practice their clinical skills on each other. This segment also includes CPR certification through the American Heart Association (mandatory; additional fees apply).

Prerequisites and Requirements

- Proof of high school diploma (in English) or GED;
- Written proof of a current TB test within 2 weeks of class start date;
- Scrubs (within 2 weeks of class start);
- English fluency as determined by a CASAS reading score of 230 or better.
- Basic computer skills including the ability to create, save, and email a document.
- Minimum typing speed of 25 words per minute

Upon successful completion of both segments of the CMA program, students will earn a Certificate of Completion, qualify to take the national or state CMA licensing exam (additional fees apply), and may be recommended for an externship with a local partner health care provider. To receive a recommendation for a 160-hour externship with a local health care provider, students must achieve the following in the CMA program:

- Attendance of 90% of course hours (both segments)
- Grade average of 90%;
- Completion of ALL (100%) of course skills/assignments;
- Mastery level competency and comprehension of the learned skills.

Dental Careers for Adults

The San Juan Unified School District's Dental Careers CTE Program is a two-semester program focused on dental assisting and careers in the dental field. Dental Careers is a ten-month program which begins in August and ends in June. The course is taught on the Encina Preparatory High School's campus in room E-2. Certifications earned during the program include:

- Eight Hour Infection Control
- California Dental Practice Act (DPA)
- OSHA Bloodborne Pathogen Standards
- Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA)
- Healthcare Provider Level of CPR



All certificates earned during the Dental Careers CTE Program are required by the Dental Board of California for entry level employment as an unlicensed Dental Assistant (DA) and for qualification to take California's state board examination to become a licensed Registered Dental Assistant (RDA).

Dental core and operating procedures taught during the Dental Careers Program include, but are not limited to dental anatomy, restorative and periodontal charting, names and functions of dental hand instruments and equipment, sterilization, disinfection, operatory preparation, performing four-handed dentistry, and assisting the dentist throughout routine dental procedures.

The Dental Radiation Safety Program is a separate course which is taught during the second semester for an additional fee. Students enrolled in the Dental Careers CTE Program will be required to take the Dental Radiation Safety Program while attending an internship.

Instructional Assistant Preparation

The purpose of this class is to assist students in preparing for the SJUSD Instructional Assistant test. The test is comprised of three parts as follows: Assisting instruction; English/Grammar/Reading comprehension; and mathematics (focusing on basic skills and pre-algebra concepts).

Students will use a variety of materials, resources (including online programs) and technology in the classroom. Students will work independently, as well as collectively, by being part of whole-class instructional lessons and related activities, assignments, and skill-building tasks. Job Readiness

Job Readiness is a course that provides instruction on basic computer skills, résumés, cover letters, references, and thank you letter writing. In addition, the curriculum includes interviewing, overcoming barriers to employment, labor market information, and interest profiler assessment.

The class consists of a total of 24 hours of instruction over 4 weeks, with 6 hours per week: 5 hours in-person and 1 hour on-line. Lessons repeat every 4 weeks, so students may enroll at any time and attend for a 4-week period. A certificate is issued for successful completion of the course. **There is no cost to enroll. 

General Information

Registration and Attendance

Registration is required for all classes. Early registration is recommended as some classes fill quickly. Registration is on a first-come, first served basis until classes are full.

- You can register online (http://bit.ly/SJAEregister) or in person for most Career Technical Education and all Community Education classes.
- Academic and ESL classes require in-person on-site registration.
- High School Diploma and Independent Study require meeting with our counselor.

Classes that don't meet the minimum enrollment or that have low attendance may be cancelled. The District reserves the right to discontinue, shorten, postpone, or combine classes, and/or change instructors. Classes may be discontinued on or before the first scheduled meeting if fewer than the required minimum number of students are enrolled. Checks will be held until classes meet minimum enrollment

Attendance is required to remain enrolled in classes. Students in academic classes will be dropped after 2 weeks of unexcused absences.

Funding and Tuition

Community Education classes are offered to meet the needs and interests of adult learners and are entirely supported by tuition and receive no state funding. Tuition is nominal and covers the cost of the instructor, facility, and related expenses. Students may register for community education courses online or in person.

State and Federal Subsidized Courses are

partially funded by the State of California and the federal government through grants. Students must register for subsidized classes in person. Registration is typically open throughout the school year.



Refunds for classes will ONLY be given if the class is cancelled by the District. If a class is cancelled due to insufficient enrollment, a full

refund will be made in the form of a check issued by the District. No cash refunds. A minimum enrollment is required for each class. Refund checks will be mailed only to the registered party or individual who made the payment and may take six weeks for processing. Please select your classes carefully as there are no refunds. If you miss the first class session, you may be dropped, and there is no refund.

Tuition is subject to change. Class tuition is based on costs to offer the program. Tuition must be paid at the time of registration. Books and supplies are additional, unless otherwise indicated. A \$25 fee will be charged for all checks returned due to insufficient funds.

- Tuition does not include books unless specified.
- · Tuition does not include state exam or licensing fees.
- We do not sell books. Unless noted in course information, students are required to purchase books through an online or local vendor of their choice.
- Some students may need more time to complete all courses.
- Tuition must be paid in full at time of registration.
- No refunds are available unless your class is cancelled.
- Classes will be cancelled one week prior to start date if classes do not meet a minimum enrollment.
- We are on the SETA ETPL/LTPL provider list. Some students may qualify for financial aid or assistance through SETA or another funding agency. You are encouraged to visit a local One Stop agency to seek financial assistance or to see if you qualify.
- GED® test registration and payment is exclusively through GED® Testing Service at www.ged.com.

Sexual Harassment

(District Policy 5145.7)

The District has adopted the following strict policy containing rules and procedures for reporting sexual harassment and pursuing remedies. "The Governing Board prohibits unlawful sexual harassment of or by any student by anyone in or from the District. Sexual harassment

is unwelcome sexual advances, request for sexual favors, and other verbal, visual, or physical contact of a sexual nature made by someone from or in the work or educational setting. Any student who engages in sexual harassment of another student or anyone from the District may be subject to disciplinary action up to and including expulsion. Any employee who permits or engages in sexual harassment may be subject to disciplinary action up to and including dismissal." Any student, staff member, or parent who feels that harassment has occurred should immediately contact the teacher, principal of the school, or the District Title IX Coordinator.

If the concern is not resolved, a formal complaint may be initiated at the school or by directly contacting the District Title IX Coordinator at 916-971-7110.

Uniform Complaint Procedure

The Superintendent or designee shall annually provide written notification of the District's uniform complaint procedures (UCP) to students, employees, parents/guardians, the District advisory committee, school advisory committees, appropriate private school officials or representatives, and other interested parties (5 CCR 4622). The Superintendent or designee shall make available copies of the District's uniform complaint procedures free of charge. (5 CCR 4622)

The District is primarily responsible for compliance with state and federal laws and regulations.

The District shall investigate and seek to resolve complaints at the local level using policies and proce- dures adopted by the local board as the Uniform Complaint Procedures. These procedures shall be used when addressing complaints alleging unlawful discrimination based on actual or perceived sex, sexual orientation, ethnic group identification, race, ancestry, national origin, religion, age, gender, color or physical or mental disability, or failure

to comply with state and/or federal laws in adult education, consolidated categorical aid programs, career technical and technical education and training programs, Indian education, migrant education, child care and development programs, child nutrition programs, and special education programs.

Any individual, public agency or organization may file a written com- plaint of alleged noncompliance by the District (5 CCR 4630). Complain- ants shall be protected from retalia- tion and the identity of a complainant alleging discrimination shall remain confidential as appropriate. The District complaint review shall be completed within 40 calendar days from the date of receipt of the com- plaint unless the parties have agreed in writing to an extension of the timeline. An unlawful discrimination complaint must be filed not later than six months from the date the alleged discrimination occurs, or six months from the date the complainant first obtains knowledge of the facts of the alleged discrimination.

The complainant has a right to appeal the District's decision to the California Department of Education (CDE) by filing a written appeal within 15 days of receiving the District's decision. The appeal to the CDE must include a copy of the complaint filed with the District and a copy of the District's decision. The complainant has a right to take some complainant has a right to take some remedies before civil courts or other public agencies.

APPEALS TO THE CALIFORNIA DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION

You may appeal the District's decision to the CDE by filing a written appeal with the State Superintendent within 15 days after receiving the District decision. The appeal must:

- 1. Specify the basis for the appeal of the decision and whether the facts are incorrect and/or the law is misapplied.
- 2. Include a copy of the original complaint and a copy of the District's decision.

Civil Law Remedies

Civil law remedies may be available under state or federal discrimination laws, if applicable. A complainant may pursue available civil law remedies outside of the District's complaint procedures.

Complainants may seek assistance from mediation centers or public/private interest attorneys. Civil law remedies that may be imposed by a court include, but are not limited to, injunctions and restraining orders.
